




The **Green Accord** is an accreditation scheme that helps companies to implement sustainable working practices in their business.

1. Reduce costs

The Green Accord requires more efficient use of resources to reduce environmental impact, which will typically bring a saving on utilities, waste and transport costs.

2. Create business opportunities

3. Practical

The Green Accord provides practical guidance and support, to implement the changes in business operations for company benefit. It's about deeds, not words.

The Green Accord is an inclusive scheme, and the cost structure reflects that. It costs £100 (+VAT) for companies with 5 employees or less, £200 (+VAT) with over 5 employees & £500 (+VAT) with 250+ employees

7. Inclusive

The Green Accord accreditation is available on three levels, from Select through to Premier Status, so giving companies recognition applicable to their level of achievement and ability.

8. Transferable

Green Accord accreditation lasts for 2 years and is transferable, allowing you to demonstrate your environmental credentials to any client. Accreditation belongs to you, and gives you a tool for long-term business success.
